## **Resident Meeting August 5, 2024 @ 11 AM Piano Area – In Person & Zoom**

### **Call to order by Larry Theye**

### **Approval of Past Minutes:**

- There was a motion, second and unanimous approval of the June 3, 2024 Meeting Minutes.

### **Director's Report: Steve Bowler**

- Waterfront Update
  - Plantings, Gazebo Area & Stairway; over 100 plants were put along the shorefront to help reduce any erosion of the soil. The area looks very good thanks to Maintenance and Tim watering the plants this summer. We will be looking at options for using the area. The Gazebo area has lots of smaller stones to help reduce ground erosion.
  - North side plans – there were permitting issues with our neighbor to the north so that has been delayed. Elwell Construction will be fixing our north side washout areas for free in exchange for access to the neighbor's property.
- New Tax Valuation
  - 2024 - Land \$3,440,000; Buildings \$8,466,400 for a total of \$11,906,600, up 17% from 2023. There has not been a full revaluation in Belfast since 2003. They now have a 100% ratio between assessed and fair market value. The Council approved a 6% increase to the overall city budget, but we will not know the impact until late August which makes it a best guess for our budget next week.
  - 2023 - Total was \$10,206,920.
- Dining Update
  - July Resident Meal Count 806 + 7/30 & 7/31 totaled 856.
  - June Resident Meal Count 843; these meals counts are good for the summer. Steve thanked Emerson and the Dining Committee for their hard work. The number of actual diners in the dining room is down this summer; we are working on incentives to bring more people into the dining room.
- Maintenance Update
  - BAS – HVAC System Install Underway – Mechanical Controls have been in the Ocean House the past few months setting up a new computer system and connecting the boilers, rooftop units, thermostats, and insuring safety devices like smoke detectors are working and in the right places. The hope to have the whole Ocean House on-line this fall.
  - Windows and doors are being replaced – Maintenance has been evaluating windows for needing replacement. We had to reorder doors that were the wrong size. Windows in Cottage #38 were replaced last week.
  - Quad 53–59 Siding & Windows – Darren reported that residing is moving along; he has found very few issues with rot that were easy to fix. We think we are under budget on the project; we have spent \$125,196 of the \$228,000 budget. The plan is to do quad 1 – 7 next year, then quad 9-15 in 2026 and then move around to the duplexes. Steve will share some color options for consideration at the August Building & Grounds Meeting.
  - Street Lights – we have Mac Electric here today to look at our street lights. They are replacing a sensor that we hope will fix the issue.

### **Sales**

- Apartment #113 has a P&S with Barney Lutsk to close September 30. Jean has moved to Thorton Hall in Brunswick and is doing well.

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- Cottage #38 has a P&S with the Bowles to close September 1. Josh Pease will be doing renovations.
- Cottage #36 has a P&S with the Moores to close October 1. Josh will be doing renovations here too.
- Apartment #301 to be sold to the current sublessee; close November 1. Rhoda Waller will be purchasing the unit.
- 5% Contribution to the Replacement Reserve by the Buyer & Seller – we put \$125,000 into the budget, but it is looking like the actual number will be \$275,000.
